WESTON AREA EMERGENCY SUPPORT

Dear Congregants:

Thank you very much for your wonderful food donation to WAES this October. Fall is a very busy time at WAES. Families feel the pinch of the added costs for back to school, and sometimes they just can't afford enough food to feed their children. Your food drive helped us to fill our shelves with healthy food to share with those in our community that need our support.

This year (to September) we have had over 7,100 client visits to WAES. We are continually amazed to see more people coming to us for basic food support. Each person has a story, and most just want to be able to feed their families and pay their rent. Over 50% of the people that come to us have a disability, and nearly 60% are families with children. These children attend school each day, with 30% going hungry at least once per week. All that being said, our volunteers do what we can to offer healthy food, smiles and encouragement to all those that walk into our space.

Your support helps us to do this valuable work, and we all appreciate your contribution. Thank you all very much.
