#### "COULD YOU SPEND ONE HOUR WITH ME?"

This Sunday afternoon, April 23, St. John the Evangelist Parish will celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy from 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Come join us for the celebration of Divine Mercy for prayer, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction.

The Feast originated from apparitions of Jesus to Saint Faustina Kowalska in which He said, "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners.

On that day...the soul that will go to confession (this can be eight days before or after the Feast) and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment... It is My desire that (the Feast) be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter."

The fact that God is merciful should not surprise us. The Holy Bible has over 400 direct references to the Mercy of God. There are many more indirect references. Fifty-five of the Psalms praise God's Mercy. Belief in a Merciful God became one of the characteristics of the Jewish religion. The greatest act of God's Mercy toward mankind was to send His Son. We had lost the way to God, the truth about God and a life in God by our own fault. Jesus came to give us the Way, to give us the Truth and to give us new Life.

#### **News on the After Fire Clean-up**

I would like to update you on what has transpired since the fire on Easter Sunday morning. Please be re-assured that the costs are covered by the insurance company, minus a small deductable. All work is being done by contractors that have worked with Catholic Mutual Canada, our insurer, and approved by our Archdiocese.

After the initial fire there was a forensic investigation by both the police and fire services. The church was released after the completion of their onsite investigation Sunday afternoon. At that time a representative from the insurance company, along with a fire clean-up company, came for a meeting to assess damage. A company was also sent to board up the broken window.

The clean-up started up on Monday morning by removing all books, vestments, and cloths for off-site cleaning and decontamination. The cleaning of the church surfaces started with scrubbing using special sponges to remove the initial soot, followed by washing. Scaffolding and ladders were also used to dislodged the contaminates from the ceiling in the main body of the church and all the beams. Initial decontamination of the ceiling was performed. All cupboards, drawers and closets were emptied, cleaned and all items in them that were not sent away for decontamination were washed and packaged and moved to the basement. Cabinets from the sacristy were removed, cleaned and moved into the basement pending further repairs to the sacristy. The charred wall and floor and window framing was removed. Upon completion of the cleaning and decontamination of all the surfaces a carpet cleaning was performed. The books and vestments were shipped back to the church from the cleaning facility on Friday afternoon.

A heating company analysed all heating equipment and performed duct cleaning. A specialized electronics company decontaminated all electronic equipment, including sound system, keyboard and organ. All components were cleaned and tested, some by removing them off site. A structural engineer was retained to ascertain if there was any structural damage to the floors, ceilings and supporting beams.

This concludes the preliminary emergency cleaning. Thus far 800 work hours were spent on cleaning the church which does not include time spent for cleaning and decontamination of vestments, books and cloths offsite. So far, the approximate cost incurred by the insurance company is just under \$50,000.00.

The next phase which will be the more difficult will include bringing equipment and/or scaffolding to be further able to thoroughly clean the ceiling throughout the whole church and repaint all surfaces. Also the charred and smoke damaged ceiling wood and beams over the sanctuary and in the sacristy will have to be sanded, stained to match the existing colour and sealed. The fire-damaged floor and wall will have to be reconstructed and finished. This next phase will take much longer once it begins and may require the closing of the main church body or even the whole church for up to three weeks. We have met with various companies specialized in after-fire restoration and various avenues are being examined to lessen the time the church will be required to be closed.

We will keep you posted as we know further details.
