**Mission Co-op Collection
June 24/25**

Next weekend, June 24/25, there will be a second collection for our annual mission co-op appeal, the mission Archdiocese of Imphal.

The mission Archdiocese of Imphal is situated in the extreme corner of Northeast India. It was erected in 1980 comprising the entire state of Manipur. Archdiocese of Imphal is home to 35 tribes of Mongolian origin, living in small villages perched on mountain tops and practicing one of the most rudimentary methods of farming called shifting (Jhum) cultivation. Most of these villages are not connected with all season roads and sadly lacking other basic necessities like electricity, telephones, schools, hospitals, etc.

The first Catholic baptism in the diocese was recorded in 1952. The Catholic population has grown up to 100,000 now. The diocese has 45 parishes and 5 Mission Centres, 160 priests including 67 indigenous tribal priests. The growth of the Church has always been accompanied by various challenges and persecutions during the past decades. Between 1990 - 2001, six of our young and dynamic missionaries were killed for witnessing the gospel. In spite of these challenges, missionary efforts are yielding an increase in vocation to priesthood or religious life.

The proceeds of the 2017 Mission appeal will be used to build for training 25 Touring Catechists for the parishes. Your generous support and prayers will be of great help for the evangelization work in the Diocese of Imphal that began 66 years ago.

Humanitarian Relief-Famine in Africa

The Archdiocese of Toronto joins the CCCB and faith communities across Canada in launching a joint appeal, entitled **Pray-Give-Speak Out**, in response to the desperate food crisis in South Sudan, Yemen, Nigeria and Somalia.

The United Nations has confirmed that South Sudan has 100,000 people living in famine conditions. Reports suggest a total of 20 million people are on the brink of starvation in the region. A declaration of famine has not been made by UN agencies since July 2011 when some 260,000 people died in Somalia - half of them children under the age of five. The world must not let those horrors be repeated.

The joint appeal aims to engage the faithful in three ways:

Pray: Keeping the people of South Sudan, Somalia, Nigeria and Yemen in our prayers.

Give: Making a financial contribution to support those affected by the crisis.

Speak Out: Becoming better informed and to speak about the crisis with family, friends and neighbours. Contacting their local Members of Parliament about their concerns.

Note: The Government of Canada has created a "Famine Relief Fund." The federal government will match every donation made until June 30, 2017, by individuals to registered Canadian charities participating in this campaign.

afternoon at 2:00 p.m.**

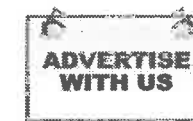

All Eucharistic devotion is related to the sacrifice of the Mass, which perpetuates Jesus' death and resurrection. Holy Thursday actually marks the anniversary of the institution of the Eucharist. But since it comes at a time when the commemoration of Jesus' passion and death overshadows everything else, the Church has given us this feast to bring out the joyous aspect of Holy Thursday, the gift of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. May we always give thanks to God for this wonderful gift.

This he did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and so to entrust to his beloved Spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal banquet 'in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us.'"
