A Biblical Walk Through The Mass Fourth Session -Liturgy of the Eucharist: Part 1 Tuesday, March 13

Do you understand the meaning behind the parts of the Mass? In his video-based study A Biblical Walk Through the Mass, Dr. Edward Sri explores the roots of the words and gestures we experience at Mass and explains their profound significance.

On Tuesday, March 13, immediately following the 7:00 p.m. Mass, we will be showing the fourth half hour session on A Biblical Walk Through the Mass. This fourth session draws our attention to the heart of the Mass as we come to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Liturgy of the Eucharist consists of three principal parts: 1) the Preparation of the Gifts; 2) the Eucharistic Prayer; and 3) the Communion Rite. In this session, we will focus on the first two chief parts of the Liturgy of the Eucharist: the Preparation of the Gifts and the Eucharistic Prayer, while the Communion Rite will be treated in the next session.
