Fifth Session -

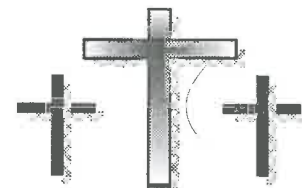
Liturgy of the Eucharist: Part 2

and Concluding Rites

Tuesday, March 20

Do you understand the meaning behind the parts of the Mass? In his video-based study *A Biblical Walk Through the Mass*, Dr. Edward Sri explores the roots of the words and gestures we experience at Mass and explains their profound significance.

Mass of Chrism

Mass of Chrism is a special Mass, held in Toronto at St. Michael’s Cathedral for the priests of the Archdiocese of Toronto, on the Tuesday of Holy Week, March 27, at 11:00 a.m. At the Chrism Mass the holy oils used in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders and Sacrament of the Sick are blessed and supplied to the local parishes for use. All are welcome to attend.

Palm Sunday is next weekend. Also called Passion Sunday, it is the Sunday before Easter. Palms are distributed as a reminder of Christ’s triumphant entry into Jerusalem.

Palms will be distributed and blessed at the beginning of each Mass.



Easter is the most important of Feast in the Christian calendar. During this time Christians celebrate the resurrection of Christ. Holy Week is the final week of preparation before Easter Sunday, these days recount Christ’s final days on earth, begins on Passion (or Palm) Sunday.

 The Resurrection of the Lord
 9:00 a.m. (no incense) and 11:00 a.m. Masses
