
New to the Parish

Cabrini Movie next Sunday 3:00 p.m.

Rated PG-13 for thematic material, some violence, language and smoking. Admission is by donation of a non-perishable food item.

Next Sunday, September 29, 2024 at 3:00 p.m. we will be hosting a movie screening on Cabrini in the Church hall. The movie Cabrini is based on the rich, inspiring true story of Francesca Xavier Cabrini, the first American saint. Arriving in New York City in 1889, Italian immigrant Francesca Cabrini is greeted by disease, crime and impoverished children. She soon sets off on a daring mission to convince the mayor to secure housing and health care for society's most vulnerable. With broken English and poor health, Cabrini uses her entrepreneurial mind to build an empire of hope unlike anything the world has ever seen.

According to the website of the organization dedicated to Cabrini (https://www.mothercabrini.org/who-we-are/mother-cabrini/), Francesca Xavier Cabrini was born in 1850 in the village of S'ant Angelo Lodigiano, located near Milan, Italy. She was the youngest of thirteen, and wanted more than anything to join a Catholic order and serve her God and her church. Cabrini desired to serve under the Daughters of the Sacred Heart - an order that had taught and mentored her - but was in too poor of health to join their ranks.



Cabrini did not let these initial setbacks keep her down. In 1880, she and seven other sisters founded their own order: the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Her scrappy and determined efforts led her to meet with Pope Leo XIII. Though she and her sisters initially requested to be sent as missionaries to China, the Pope sent the Sisters to New York to serve thousands of Italians who had immigrated to the States. Immigrants in New York - particularly those from Italy, whom Cabrini and the rest of the Sisters were charged with serving - were severely poverty-stricken. Cabrini set out to provide for the orphans, and also to offer education for all the immigrants. Eventually, she established 67 schools, hospitals, and orphanages around the world. Cabrini worked tirelessly for the betterment of the world until her death in 1917. She was canonized as a saint in 1946, and named Patroness of Immigrants in 1950.


