

Cabrini Movie this Sunday 3:00 p.m.

Rated PG-13 for thematic material, some violence, language and smoking. Admission is by donation of a non-perishable food item.

This Sunday afternoon at 3:00 p.m. we will be hosting a movie screening on Cabrini in the Church hall. The movie Cabrini is based on the rich, inspiring true story of Francesca Xavier Cabrini, the first American saint. Arriving in New York City in 1889, Italian immigrant Francesca Cabrini is greeted by disease, crime and impoverished children. She soon sets off on a daring mission to convince the mayor to secure housing and health care for society's most vulnerable. With broken English and poor health, Cabrini uses her entrepreneurial mind to build an empire of hope unlike anything the world has ever seen.



Cabrini was sent by the pope to serve the immigrants in New York - particularly those from Italy, whom Cabrini and the rest of the Sisters were charged with serving - were severely poverty-stricken. Cabrini set out to provide for the orphans, and also to offer education for all the immigrants. Eventually, she established 67 schools, hospitals, and orphanages around the world. Cabrini worked tirelessly for the betterment of the world until her death in 1917. She was canonized as a saint in 1946, and named Patroness of Immigrants in 1950.




OCTOBER ROSARY
